

HOW TO DISPOSE OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients are classified as “household hazardous waste” or “HHW.” These products require special care when you dispose of them. Hazardous wastes, like those listed below, do NOT belong in the landfill or in your curbside carts.

HOME REMODEL

- Paint
- Stain
- Varnish
- Thinner
- Adhesives

AUTOMOTIVE

- Old Fuel
- Motor Oil
- Oil Filters
- Batteries
- Antifreeze

GARDEN

- Pesticides
- Fertilizers
- Herbicides
- Insecticides

HOUSEHOLD

- Batteries
- Fluorescent Lamps
- Cleaners & Sprays
- Propane
- Home Generated Sharps (needles, syringes, lancets) in approved containers
- Prescription and over the counter medicines (no controlled substances)

Residents of Alameda County can safely and conveniently dispose of household hazardous wastes FREE of charge at Alameda County HHW disposal centers.

Must bring valid ID showing current Alameda County address. Do not mix different wastes in the same container. No individual container may be greater than 5 gal. or 50 lbs. State law limits the total amount you transport in one vehicle to 125 lbs. or 15 gal. Must be transported by a resident of the household which generated the waste.
