## APPRENTICE ELECTRIC MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN

### Definition:

Under supervision, to serve an approved standard period in the capacity of apprentice to prepare for the classification of Electric Maintenance Technician.

### Typical Tasks:

As an Apprentice, works with an Electrical Maintenance Technician or Supervisor in testing, repairing, calibration and installation of electric meters, instruments and associated electrical equipment; testing, cleaning and repair of transformers, the servicing and repair of circuit breakers and regulators, reclosers, relays and other substation apparatus; makes special load checks and tests, performs trouble-shooting work on customers' premises, performs other duties as may be required.

### Employment Standards:

Graduation from high school, or equivalent, with sufficient mathematical ability to learn alternating current theory. Must be able to communicate with associates and have sufficient reading abilities to read and interpret job orders, instructions and manufacturers' printed information. Should have some electrical construction and maintenance experience.

### Special Requirements:

Must complete prescribed apprenticeship program that requires the equivalent of one hundred forty-four (144) hours of instruction per year. This will consist of:

1. Assignments from Metering Manuals as prescribed by his supervisor.
2. Related classroom work in mathematics and electrical theory.
3. Appropriate correspondence school work.
4. Must pass Electric Maintenance Technician's examination before becoming eligible for appointment to journeyman classification.

Must possess a valid State of California driver's license.
