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ARPD DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

There is an energy building at ARPD, thanks to the hard work of our staff and the receptiveness of our community. We are developing many new programs and projects for you and your family.

This summer, ARPD is introducing several exciting new programs. We are working hard to increase the number of water-based opportunities for our island community. ARPD partnered with the Alameda DragonFlyers so youth and adults can experience paddling a dragon boat on the estuary. Bring your whole family for a free Fun Run paddle to Jack London Square. Paddle a dragon boat, then stop and shop at the Farmers' Market, stroll or have a snack, and enjoy a return paddle back to Marina Village. Adults can try their paddling skills at the new paddler clinic, which includes a novice dragon boat race. And check out the teen camp, which also culminates in a race.

There are numerous new sports camps including lacrosse and more opportunities for girls' sports such as volleyball, a basketball skills clinic and cheerleading.

This summer we celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Summer Day Camp program! We'll have a community-wide reunion event at summer's end for everyone who attended camp as a kid or was on staff. Keep an eye on our website or sign up for email and Facebook for details.

ARPD is thrilled to offer a new community event that brings us back to our historical roots. Alameda Heritage Day is Saturday, September 28th at Washington Park. We will celebrate Alameda history, host an art fair, games, jumpers, food and music. Plus aquatic activities at the Encinal Boat Ramp with boating demonstrations and an open water swim competition in collaboration with the Alameda Aquatic Masters. Please contact ARPD if you would like to serve on our steering committee or be a sponsorship partner.

We are continuing work on several exciting projects, such as Beltline Park. We recently completed an extensive and productive community process with 240 people attending the meetings and 659 survey responses. There was substantial interest in trails and passive uses such as a community garden. There was also a strong interest expressed for a pool facility. The conceptual use plan will be discussed by City Council in the late spring. Contact ARPD to get on a Beltline interest email list.

ARPD is applying to the State Department of Boating and Waterways for a significant grant to fully renovate the Encinal Boat Ramp. The project scope includes replacing the existing launch float, installing a new non-motorized craft float, renovating the parking lot, adding a new restroom, lights, and fish cleaning station. We are also thrilled to welcome the O'kalani Outrigger Canoe Club back to Alameda where they were founded. They are making their home at the Encinal Boat Ramp.
